

Friday February 31

Welcome back everyone to term one of 2025! It's been a busy couple of weeks preparing our school for the return of students and staff, with lots of mowing, garden trimming, carpet cleaning, gutter clearing and window cleaning happening around the school. The school planned maintenance program has progressed quickly over the summer, with roof cladding being replaced on the Stadium, the Design and Technology wing, and across parts of the main classroom wing; the next stage of the project will focus on replacing and painting wooden window frames around the school. We are always working hard to keep our school neat and well-maintained, and I'm grateful to our school cleaner (Marg) and our maintenance worker (Steve) for their efforts in preparing our school for the return of students.

A big welcome to new members of our teaching staff – to Mr. Prentice who will be teaching secondary maths and science classes, to Mr. Trussler who will be working as an artisan teacher with Shannon in the Hands on Learning program, and to Michelle Lehmann, a new member of our Education Support team. With teacher shortages still prevalent across Victoria, it is very satisfying to start the year with all primary and secondary classes covered and knowing that we have great teachers working with our students.

I would also like to welcome families who are new to our school in 2025, with students embarking on their first week at Hawkesdale College from Prep all the way through to Year 10. It is pleasing to note that student enrolment numbers are significantly larger this year than at the start of 2024, and that eight Prep students are starting their educational journey with us this year. It was great to see many families taking the opportunity to have a tea or coffee together before our welcome back to school assembly on Wednesday, and to meet school staff – a most positive start to the year.

Students new and returning have access to a wide range of inexpensive uniform items at our school, including our new, comfortable and everyday shorts and rugby tops. When you add Year 6 class hoodies and Year 12 rugby and polo tops to this mix, everyone in our school should be able to find items of uniform that both fit and suit them. Students have started off the year really well wearing correct uniform, and it is important that this continues as the year unfolds.

A big thanks to Ms White for organising our 2025 Year 12 rugby and polo tops; these were ready to go for the first day of term one, and feature a distinctive yellow, white and navy design. Our Year 12's are very proud of their new tops!

A big thanks also to the parents and staff members who volunteered to move mulch onto our indigenous and front of school gardens over the school holidays and earlier this week; there was a lot of mulch to shift in warm weather – well done for getting this done.





Please note that the date for the upcoming Year 5-12 House Swimming Sports has changed, and that this event will now be held on Friday February

14. This is always a fun day of swimming, competition and house colours, and lunchtime swim training will begin at the Hawkesdale Pool on Monday of next week. The Mid West Complex interschool swimming carnival will be held at the

Mortlake Pool on Tuesday February 18 for students who progress on from our House swimming sports. There is not a lot of time between these two events, but Mr Kingston and Mr Webb will be working hard to have our interschool swim squad organised by Monday February 17; please be aware that permission notes for MWC swimmers will be handed to students on this day, and will be available online via Compass as well – it's vital that consent to attend the MWC carnival is given once these notes arrive home. Primary swimming classes with Jayson Lamb's Splash Factory will also begin on Monday of next week, and will run for two weeks. Learning to swim is an important exercise, recreation and survival skill, and I note that the weather next week is going to be warm – perfect for swimming.

Our school will be hosting a Blue Minds Youth Leadership workshop for Year 8 to 10 students during February. This session will focus on contemporary issues around climate change, providing strategies to manage anxiety and stress related to climate change concerns, as well as building understanding about the science and impact of climate change on everyday lives. This session is particularly relevant at this point in the year, with an array of natural disasters and severe weather events crowding the news cycle that students will have seen and heard about across the summer break. Survey research conducted by the Orygen Institute in 2023 notes that two-thirds of young Australians (67%) are reporting a negative impact on youth mental health caused by climate concerns. The discussion, activities and information covered by the Blue Minds Leadership presenters will complement the emotional regulation and environmental change strands of the Victorian Health, Science and Humanities curriculum, as well as exploring the actions that individuals and communities can take towards better environmental sustainability. A big thanks to the Moyne Shire for providing this valuable learning experience for our students.

Welcome to the library!








The Hawkesdale Community Book Club will first meet for 2025 next Wednesday 5


