

Principal's Report Friday 7th February 2025

Our school hosted Hands On Learning induction training on Wednesday of this week, with eleven incoming HOL artisan teachers from across the district learning about their new roles in our HOL Shed. It was very pleasing to have been asked to host this training and is a great recognition of the productive and purposeful way that we do things in HOL at the Hawkesdale P12 College. A big thanks to Shannon for her involvement in this day, including a tour of the projects that our HOL students have completed at school over the past few years.

A reminder that Voluntary Curriculum Contributions can be made at any time to the office; these voluntary payments provide much-needed funds to extend the learning and extra-curricular opportunities that we offer to our students, and assist to cover the cost of activities such as swimming programs, sporting events, cooking in the Food Studies Room, additional library resources, incursions and classroom supplies. P-6, 7-10 and VCE Voluntary Curriculum Contributions letters were sent home to families at the end of 2024 with booklist packs. While families cannot include voluntary contributions to a payment plan, camps and excursions, PTV bus charges and uniform garments are all items that can be added. Sandra is always happy to have a conversation about setting up payments and payments plans, and can be contacted via the school office.

I'm looking forward to our annual Year 5-12 House Swimming Sports happening next week, on Friday 14th February. This is always a fun day of swimming, competition and house colours, and I

would encourage students to continue to take part in lunchtime swim training leading up to the sports. The weather on the day of the sports will be warm and sunny, and it is important that students remain SunSmart throughout the day – wearing hats, applying sunscreen and keeping well hydrated. I do not want any sunburnt students as a result of the sports; it will



be an expectation that students wear t-shirts or their school polo tops while waiting to compete in the pool, and one-piece swimwear for female students is highly recommended.

Please note that the Mid West Complex interschool swimming carnival will be held at the Mortlake Pool on Tuesday February 18 for students who progress on from our House swimming sports. There is not a lot of time between these two events, but Mr Kingston and Mr Webb will be working hard to have our interschool swim squad organised by Monday February 17; please be aware that permission notes for MWC swimmers will be handed to students after our House swimming Sports, and will be available online via Compass as well – it's vital that consent to attend the MWC carnival is given once these notes arrive home.

Primary swimming classes with Jayson Lamb's Splash Factory began this week, and will finish next week on Thursday, February 13. Learning to swim is an important exercise, recreation and survival skill, and students have been enjoying the chance to get into the cool waters of the Hawkesdale Pool on the many hot days that we have experienced so far this year.

Year 11 and 12 students are taking part in the Teen Mental Health program during term one, conducted by our School Nurse and Mental Health Practitioner. Sessions are designed to give students the skills to recognise if someone in their peer group or family is not travelling well in terms of wellbeing, and to support them in seeking support; this is a valuable life skill to develop and will be covered with other year levels across 2025.

A reminder that students new and returning have access to a wide range of inexpensive uniform items at our school, including our new, comfortable and everyday shorts and rugby tops. When you add Year 6 class hoodies and Year 12 rugby and polo tops to this mix, everyone in our school should be able to find items of uniform that both fit and suit them. Bronya is always happy to fit and sell uniform items from the Front Office, and to assist parents with ordering online items; please make contact on 55607225 if you would like to find out more about uniform items, or visit the Front Office to try on and purchase garments. Students have started off the year really well wearing correct uniform, and it is important that this continues as the year unfolds.

A reminder to students and families that **the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban** that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and

securely stored away during school hours. The Department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2025 school year, and we have been working hard as a school to make sure that this happening. The goal of this statewide Mobile Phone Policy is to make sure that schools can provide a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions, and opportunities for students to interact with each other face-to-face without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones



can cause. I would ask once again for the support of all families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school.

School Council positions typically run for two years, and several positions are due to become vacant in March of this year. With this in mind, we are starting our annual School Council election process on Friday February 14, with several parent and one student position available for nomination. Being a member of school council gives you the opportunity to support great outcomes for students at our school, and to become involved in the key duties of a Council – overseeing school finances, working on school policies, being on sub-committees that take action around school operations, and developing plans for the future. I would encourage parents to consider nominating for one of the vacant positions available this year, and for secondary students to consider nominating for the vacant student position as well. More information about the nomination process will be included in the next newsletter.



Michelle worked in a casual role in 2024 and is joining us again this year as a part time education support staff member. She will be supporting in the office and in the P-2 room.




Mark Trussler


