

Principal's Report Friday, March 13

I was very pleased to see during this week that our **Planned Maintenance Program** has accelerated across the school, with new aluminium windows in place, timber decking blasted and re-sealed, a drainage system installed along the length of the Stadium, and vegetation clearing around the Stadium – even the Tea House received a pressure wash in preparation for fresh coats of paint next week.



The Man Cave program will return to our school next week, and I would strongly encourage families to attend the evening keynote session at school on Tuesday 18th March, starting at 7pm in our College Library. The Man Cave program is designed to build emotional resilience and healthier relationships amongst young males, and to explore concepts of masculinity in modern-day society. The Parent Keynote will be

interactive and interesting and will provide lots of practical advice about how families can best support their sons and daughters as they navigate the challenges of adolescence.

A reminder that **our annual Open Night will be happening on Tuesday 25th March, 7pm-9pm**, starting from the College Library. Open Night is always a great chance for Year 5 and 6 students to think about life in Year 7 at our school, to meet some of our secondary teachers, and to try out some fun cooking, PE, design and science activities. Students and families from surrounding primary schools will also be attending, so this is also a good opportunity to meet other potential members of our 2025 Year 7 group. Open Night is always busy and enjoyable, and I'm looking forward to seeing lots of families – new and existing – at this event. Please refer to the flyer in the newsletter for more information about this event. **Don't forget also that will be holding a Welcome Back to School BBQ at 5pm prior to our Open Night, and that families new and existing are very welcome to attend!**

Next week is national Cultural Diversity Week – a great chance to reflect on the multicultural nature of modern Australian society, and the shared contribution that people of all nations have made to create the country that we live in today. Multiculturalism is a core part of the Victorian population, with over 30% of people living in our state being born overseas, and with over 290 languages spoken. In Victorian government schools over 36% of students enrolled are from language backgrounds other than English; at our school, a



wide range of different languages other than English are spoken at home, including Afrikaans, Danish, Bisaya, Ilokano, Tagalog and Samoan. For schools, this is a time to celebrate inclusiveness, respect and a sense of belonging for all Australians, from the traditional custodians of the land to those who have come from many countries around the world. **Harmony Week - Everyone Belongs** is also celebrated next week in conjunction with Cultural Diversity Week and recognises diversity and brings together Australians from all different backgrounds. Students will be involved in a range of activities next week to celebrate identity, harmony and inclusivity.

NAPLAN testing began for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 this week, and I have been pleased to note the way in which students have been approaching these online assessments. NAPLAN test results help us to make good decisions about future teaching need and are a great way for students to see learning improvement over time; results will be made known to schools in term two, and individual results booklets will be made available to families once this happens. NAPLAN testing will also continue on into next week.

The **Secondary School Immunisation Program** is up and running for 2025, and during the course of the year students in years 7 and 10 will receive free vaccinations to better protect them from preventable diseases. I note this year that the following vaccinations will be administered at school:

- HPV vaccine in Year 7
- diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine in Year 7
- meningococcal A, B, C, W, Y vaccine in Year 10



The paper consent card system that families are familiar with from past years has been replaced in 2025 with a digital app called the Vivato Parent Portal; the portal can be used to create a medical profile for individual students, and to provide vaccination consent for specific vaccines to be administered. The QR code required to initially register online can be found by scrolling down to the last page of the Parent Information 2025 pdf, which was placed on the Compass Newsfeed yesterday for all families to access. Please contact the school if you are having any difficulty downloading the app or giving vaccination consent, and please note that Year 7 and 10 vaccination day will be on Wednesday April 30, in the second week of Term 2. Moyne Shire Council will once again coordinate and administer the vaccination program throughout the year.

A reminder that our end of term Parent-Teacher-Student Conversation Day will be happening on Thursday, April 3, from 11am to 7pm. Interviews will be held at school, and will follow on from interim reports being sent home in the previous week. Interviews are a valuable chance to start a conversation about how students are working and behaving in their class subjects, and to discuss ways that students can improve their learning. While this is a School Council designated pupil free day, students are of course very welcome to be part of this conversation. Bookings for our Parent-Teacher-Student Conversation Day are now open on Compass, and I would encourage families to start making bookings if they have not already done so.

Parent-Teacher-Student Conversations - Semester 1 Interim Reports Student Free Day Thursday, 03 April 2025

Dear Parents / Guardians,

Parent-Teacher interviews will be held at school on Thursday, 03 April 2025 in order to have conversations about student achievement, effort and behaviour as noted on Semester 1 interim reports, which will be available on Compass prior to the conversation day. These meetings are a vital part of the learning partnership between parents, students, and teachers; they provide feedback about how students are progressing in their learning at this early stage of the school year and are a great chance to discuss ways in which this learning can be improved upon or extended as the year continues. We certainly encourage as many families as possible to take part in these conversations, and for students to add their voices to the conversation also.

Interviews will run from 11.00 am to 7.00 pm. Students are absolutely encouraged to attend with their families so that they can play an active part in the conversation about their learning progress, quality of work completed, and strategies for future learning improvement.

Conversations will be held either face to face or by telephone. If you are not present at the allotted time for your session, then the teacher will contact you by telephone. Please ensure that you are available to take the call and, as the teacher may be ringing you from a private mobile, be aware that it will present as an unknown number.

All parent-teacher interview bookings will be managed within Compass by logging on to the Parent Portal and following the prompts via your child/children's photo/icon to make interview bookings. Please let office staff know if you have misplaced your Compass log in details, or if you have any questions about the interview booking system, and we will quickly help out with getting you online and successfully booked for interviews.

Teaching staff will also be able to request specific interviews using the Compass system, which will appear onscreen when you follow your child/children's photo/icon to make interview bookings. Bookings for interviews using Compass have opened today, and bookings can be made up to 9am on Thursday, 03 April. Please note that Ms Vaughan, Mr Jarrad, Mr Hoeksema and Mrs Russell will not be available for interviews on this day. As per usual, interviews will last for 12 minutes, and with a 3 minute crossover time to travel to the next interview.

It is vital that interviews run to time so that the system operates smoothly; if more time is required, staff and parents should arrange another time to have a more in-depth discussion, either in person, over the telephone or via email.

If you would like to speak to a member of teaching staff but are unable to do so on the day of interviews, you are very welcome to make an appointment for a future time via the school as required. 
